Dr. Debra Davidson is Professor of Environmental Sociology, in the Department of Resource Economics and Environmental Sociology, at the University of Alberta, where she has been employed since 1999. She is internationally recognized in the sociology of climate change, serving as one of few sociologists on the IPCC, with responsibility for the ‘Agriculture and Food Security’ section of the North America chapter. She is also recipient of the Killam Award in 2016/2017.

Dr. Davidson received her Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1998), and an M.Sc. in Environmental Studies, also from the University of Wisconsin-Madison (1994). Her primary areas of research and teaching include the social dimensions of food, energy and climate change, with a particular focus on the topics of non-conventional fossil fuels development, regional-level climate change impacts and adaptation, and institutional responses to climate change. Recent publications have been featured in *Science*; *Nature Climate Change*; *Global Environmental Change*; *British Journal of Sociology*; and *Sustainability*. She is also the co-editor of *Consuming Sustainability: Critical Social Analyses of Ecological Change*, Fernwood (2005), and co-author of *Challenging Legitimacy at the Precipice of Energy Calamity*, Springer (2011). She is also the co-author of two forthcoming books, *Energy and Society, A Reader* (Oxford University Press); and *Core Concepts in Environmental Sociology* (Palgrave MacMillan).
