PLAN SUMMARY FOR EACH SUBSTANCE

ETHYL ALCOHOL (CAS NO. 64-17-5)
Statement of Intent
In accordance with s. 4(1)1 of the Toxics Reduction Act and the Facility commitment to operate under the George Weston Limited Corporate Environmental Policy which requires facilities to strive to incorporate best available technologies which are commercially realistic in its operations, intends to reduce or minimize the use of the listed substance wherever possible.
Objectives
The Weston Foods' Weston Bakeries Toronto facility does not intend to implement a reduction option for Ethyl Alcohol. The Weston Bakery Toronto facility will continue to investigate process efficiencies and continuous improvement efforts through the George Weston Limited Corporate Environmental Policy, business initiatives and product requirements in an effort to reduce the creation of Ethyl Alcohol in the future.
Description of Creation of Substance
All of the Ethyl Alcohol created is a result of the natural fermentation of yeast during the baking process. It is considered a biogenic substance in this instance. The Ethyl Alcohol is released during the baking process.
Rationale for No Option(s) to be Implemented
In accordance with s. 4(1)6 of the Toxic Reduction Act, the Weston Bakery Toronto facility has completed a detailed technical, and in some cases an economical, review of all proposed options within the seven mandatory categories and as a result of this in-depth evaluation, is choosing not to implement any of the options. The Weston Bakeries Toronto facility will continue to investigate process efficiencies and continuous improvement efforts through the George Weston Limited Corporate Environmental Policy, business initiatives and product requirements, as it has done continually throughout the years, in an effort to reduce toxic substances where feasible.


