Dr Zia Mehrabi is a Post Doctoral Fellow at the UBC School of Public Policy and Global Affairs, the Centre for Sustainable Food Systems and the Institute for Environment Resources and Sustainability at the University of British Columbia. He obtained his DPhil (BBSRC funded in Food Security) and BA (Biological Sciences) at the University of Oxford. His interest's span the design of productive ecosystems, the impacts of agriculture on the environment, climate impacts on agriculture, data development, and the use of technology and data for evidence-based decision-making in agriculture. He has worked in horticulture, grain crops, and agroforestry systems in Canada, UK, Ethiopia, Angola, Democratic Republic of Congo, for both small holders and large-scale producers, and works on development and analysis of global data for assessing the historical and future trajectories agriculture with respect to climate risk and food system diversification. He has won a variety of academic awards and grants, has academic papers and thought pieces in print in internationally recognized journals, serves as an advisory to the CGIAR's Community of Practice on Data Driven Agronomy, and is a contributing author to IPBES.
